### **Capital Project Funding**

Although we have the ability to fund all of our capital projects within the preliminary 2023-2024 budget, the district will apply for Regular Operating District Grants (ROD) in order to offset costs.

In 2022, legislation was signed which allocated \$350 million in ROD Grant Funding for high-priority capital projects in school districts throughout the State.

Opportunity to receive <u>UP TO</u> 40% (approximately \$1.2 million) reimbursement of eligible project costs.
