What is a School Counselor?

"Professional school counselors, formerly referred to as guidance counselors, advocate for students and are important members of the educational team. They consult and collaborate with teacher, administrators, and families to help all students be successful academically, vocationally, and personally. School Counseling programs promote school success through a focus on academic achievement, prevention, and intervention activities, advocacy, social/emotional/behavioral needs, and career development." (American School Counselor Association, 2005 & 1997)

Guidance Lessons

The School Counselor teaches guidance lessons in each classroom. Topics include Character Education (Respect, Caring,, Responsibility, Fairness, Trustworthiness, and Citizenship), Social Skills, Study Skills, and

Bullying Prevention.

Small Groups

Throughout the school year, the School Counselor runs small groups that may

address such issues as: grief/loss, family change/divorce, anger management, emotional control, social skills, study skills, self-esteem, behavior, conflict resolution, etc. If you are interested in having your child be part of one of these groups, please contact Mrs. Donatiello. Students may also be referred by teachers and other school staff or they may refer themselves. The School Counselor will obtain parental permission for students to take part in small group sessions.

What are some issues that a student may discuss with the School Counselor?

How are students referred to the School Counselor?

Students may be referred to the counselor by parents/ guardians, teachers, administrators, other students, themselves, or by counselor's observations. The School Counselor will obtain parental permission for on-going counseling sessions.

Intervention & Referral Services (I&RS)

Intervention and Referral Services is a committee composed of educators from various disciplines that provides assistance to students who are experiencing academic, emotional, and/or behavioral concerns. The committee utilizes its' members varied expertise to compose action plans to help students achieve academic success.
